COMMUNICATIONS UPDATE

From September we will be using the Weduc app for all of our communications - emails, messaging, calendar updates, news, notices and information.

All students, parents/carers and staff will have access to the Weduc app. You will be sent your unique login details before the start of the next academic year.

Linked to the Weduc app is our new website which will integrate with the app.

From inside the Weduc app you will be able to see your child's details and update them; pay for items (via ParentPay); send messages to staff; report absence; read our digital noticeboard as well as being able to view your child's behaviour and achievement points. You will also be able to access the school calendar as well as Class Charts and other apps and information from within the Weduc platform.

You will also be able to click on a link to another product linked to Weduc, SchoolCloud, the Parents' Evening booking system which includes video meetings for our virtual Parents' Evenings next year.

Weduc will be our only communications method and we will no longer use SchoolComms/School Gateway from September.




MOVED HOUSE? CHANGED PHONE NUMBER? NEW EMAIL ADDRESS?

Yashwant is joining us from Gosford Park Primary School and he's looking forward to trying out new lessons.




Libby is joining us from Earlsdon Primary School and she says "I am looking forward to making new friends and trying out new subjects, especially Science and History."




Angela joins Blue Coat from St Mary & St Benedict Catholic Primary School and she says "I am excited to join Blue Coat School to meet new friends."



IS YOUR CHILD ENTITLED TO FUNDING SUPPORT?

Free School Meals are NOT just about free lunches! If your family meet a certain criteria your children will be entitled to free school meals but that is not all! Whilst free lunches are healthy and nutritious, students do not *have* to claim their free meal. However, being entitled to a free school meal means your child's school receives funding for six years and this can be used to help to fund valuable teaching and learning support. We are also able to assist with the cost of school trips and revision guides, amongst other things. To find out if your family are entitled to free school meals, click on the logo.



VISITING SCHOOL SITE

We would like to remind you that we do not allow parents/carers on to the school site to drop off lunches, PE kits, books or any other forgotten items for their child. Nor do we allow parents/carers on site to collect their child for appointments. Appointments should be made outside of school time ideally, but if they must be made in school time, students need to know in advance so they can leave their lesson and make their way to reception to sign out. We will then allow your child to meet you at the gate, once we can see you on the CCTV cameras.

VOICES FOR A GREEN FUTURE - COMPETITION


Listen up future leaders! If you were in charge of the country, what would YOU do to help solve climate change and look after the planet?
