

CAREERS FAIR

During October, we held our largest careers fair to date, having not being able to offer 'in-person' events for the last couple of years, due to Covid restrictions.

We had over 40 providers from a variety of areas including higher eduction institutions - Coventry University, Lincoln University and Warwick University as well as further eduction providers Coventry College, Future Pro and WGG.

There was also information on apprenticeships from MTC, Coventry City Council and HOET and from employers such as the NHS, Cadent, Barclays and the Royal Navy.

All Year 11, 12 and 13 students had the opportunity to engage with the providers, where they could ask questions and discover pathways available to them after leaving school such as finding apprenticeships, accessing further eduction and how to get into University. The feedback from the providers was exceptionally positive about the students, with some saying it was the best careers fair they had been to in post-Covid times. The students did themselves and the school proud and really relished the opportunity.

The Careers Department has collected feedback following the event which shows a massive leap in confidence and aspiration from students which is so wonderful to see.

Our Sixth Form students were really impressed by the responses and questions that the Key Stage 2 students discussed during the assembly.






YEAR 7 BLACK HISTORY MONTH EVENT

FLOODING IN PAKISTAN


Pakistan has been devastated by flooding that began in June. It is now estimated a third of the country, an area equivalent to the size of the UK, is now under water.

A state of emergency was declared in August, with over 30 million people affected by flooding as a result of heavy monsoon rainfall. The severe consequences CARE to homes, food and crops, livestock, infrastructure and sanitation have overwhelmed rescue and aid agencies and international assistance has been called on to provide relief.

Restart a Heart Day takes place each October and relates to cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) and defibrillator use, and first aid surrounding heart attacks.

The aim of Restart a Heart Day is to bring awareness, education, and training to the general public in order to increase the likelihood of lives being saved in the event of a heart attack. The early moments of a heart attack are critical and a trained person on the scene can make the vital difference.

On October 17, Year 9 students took part in this day by learning how to do CPR and basic first aid as part of their PSHE programme.


