

<b>Extremism</b>	Is vocal or active opposition to fundamental British values, including democracy, the rule of law, individual liberty and mutual respect and tolerance of different faiths and beliefs. We also include in our definition of extremism calls for the death of members of our armed forces, whether in this country or overseas.
<b>Radicalisation</b>	The process by which a person comes to support terrorism and extremist ideologies associated with terrorist groups. <i>During the process of radicalisation, it is possible to intervene to prevent vulnerable people being radicalised.</i>
<b>Terrorism</b>	An action that endangers or causes serious violence to a person/people, causes serious damage to property, or seriously interferes or disrupts an electronic system. The use of threat must be designed to influence the government or to intimidate the public and is made for the purpose of advancing a political, religious or ideological cause.
<b>Prevent</b>	Stop people becoming terrorists or supporting terrorism. Safeguarding vulnerable people from radicalisation is no different from safeguarding from other forms of harm.
