




LIVING LIFE IN ALL ITS FULLNESS

This year's theme is 'Behind the Lens' and celebrates LGBTQ+ peoples' contribution to cinema and film from behind the lens.


The PSHE ambassadors and the Pride Group are held a bake sale to raise money for Mind Out which is a LGBTQ+ mental health charity.




#WORLDBOOKDAY
