At Blue Coat School Sixth Form, we are committed to ensuring that you get the opportunity to experience life in all its fullness throughout your time here as a sixth form student and beyond. Our enrichment programme has been designed to reflect this and has 2 main aims:

- 1. To build and develop skills and personal qualities outside of the classroom that will enable you to become well-rounded individuals that Universities and employers will want to have at their establishments
- 2. To support and improve your mental health and overall well-being

Our enrichment programme offers a breadth of experiences and opportunities that will enable you to flourish both as a sixth form student and also in preparing you for the next stage in your education pathway. This booklet is a guide to support you in the opportunities that are available to you to complete our enrichment programme.



Why is Enrichment Important?



Completing enrichment activities helps you to become a well rounded adult. Being at school teaches us more than just our subject exam curriculum, and enrichment helps to build on this wider learning.

Universities, apprenticeship providers and employers look for students who have gone above and beyond during their time at sixth form, taking part in a variety of different activities. These activities will give you skills that are transferable into university study and employment.

To support you with gaining these experiences, we have an enrichment programme at Blue Coat which is bespoke to you as an individual.

to wellbeing to ensure that you are engaged in activities that will improve your overall wellbeing, whilst giving you transferable skills that will make you desirable to Universities, apprenticeship providers and employers. The enrichment programme has these 5 strands:



Expectations



When you apply for University courses or apprenticeships, it is going to benefit you to be able to quantify the enrichment activities that you have undertaken . Your tutors can then also use this as evidence when writing UCAS or any other references. With that in mind, we have created the Blue Coat: Platimum, Gold, Silver and Bronze enrichment awards to recognise the enrichment that you complete. Enrichment can be undertaken in school, or in activities outside of school but all activities must be logged.

Bronze Blue Coat Enrichment Award (Minimum expectation)



- 25 hours completed
- 3 strands
- Minimum of 1 hour from each strand

Silver Blue Coat Enrichment Award



- 50 hours completed
- 3 strands
- Minimum 5 hours in each strand

Gold Blue Coat Enrichment Award

- 75+ hours completed
- 3 strands
- Minimum 5 hours in each strand
- Includes "Give" strand



Platinum Blue Coat Enrichment Award

- 150+ hours completed
- 4 strands
- Minimum 5 hours in each strand
- Includes "Give" strand

Logging Enrichment

Each half term you will be given an enrichment tracking card. You are responsible for getting your enrichment hours signed off by a teacher, student leader or supervisor. Each activity must be signed off on the day of the session/activity.



Coventry Pathways Hub




Christian Union






