
1. To build and develop skills and personal qualities outside of the classroom that will enable you to become well-rounded individuals that Universities and employers will want to have at their establishments

Universities, apprenticeship providers and employers look for students who have gone above and beyond during their time at sixth form, taking part in a variety of different activities. These activities will give you skills that are transferable into university study and employment.

To support you with gaining these experiences, we have an enrichment programme at Blue Coat which is bespoke to you as an individual.

When you apply for University courses or apprenticeships, it is going to benefit you to be able to quantify the enrichment activities that you have undertaken . Your tutors can then also use this as evidence when writing UCAS or any other references. With that in mind, we have created the Blue Coat: Platinum, Gold, Silver and Bronze enrichment awards to recognise the enrichment that you complete. Enrichment can be undertaken in school, or in activities outside of school but all activities must be logged.



Logging Enrichment

Each half term you will be given an enrichment tracking card. You are responsible for getting your enrichment hours signed off by a teacher, student leader or supervisor. Each activity must be signed off on the day of the session/activity.


